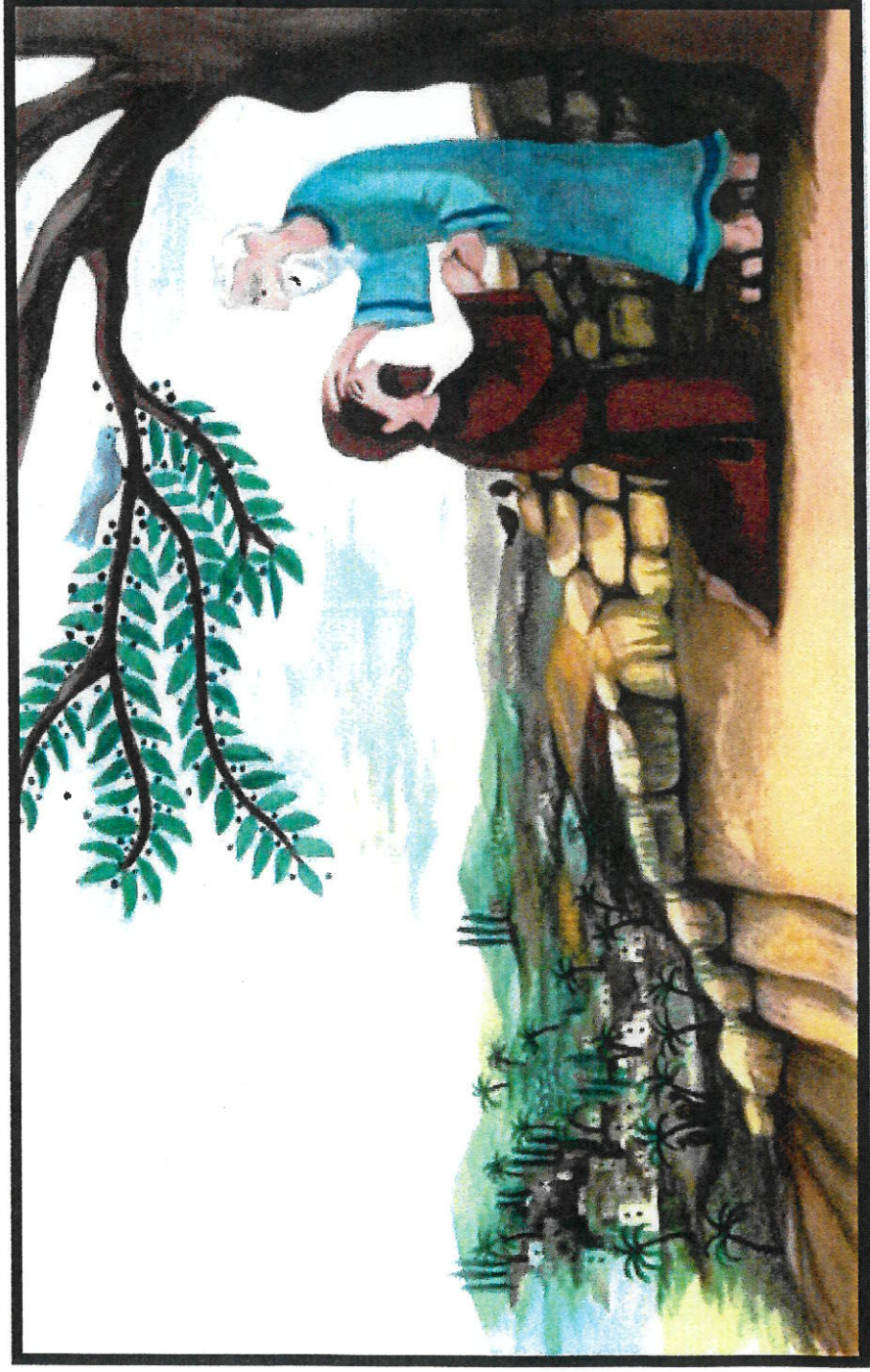

## LIVE IT

### For families to do together

Pray for bullies — specific ones — together. Work into your mealtime or bedtime prayers a prayer for the people in your life/lives who are mean, causing problems, and bullying. Far from being a negative exercise, this will give you all opportunities to hear about troubles in your individual lives and you will learn from each other how to handle such instances. You will also be following Jesus' command to "pray for your enemies."

### For younger kids

Saul had to depend on his friends when he suddenly could not see. Have someone blindfold you and try some everyday tasks like eating and getting dressed. What gets harder when you can't see? Is anything easier when you can't see?

### For older kids

Find out where Damascus is on a map or globe. Check the maps in your Bible for starters.



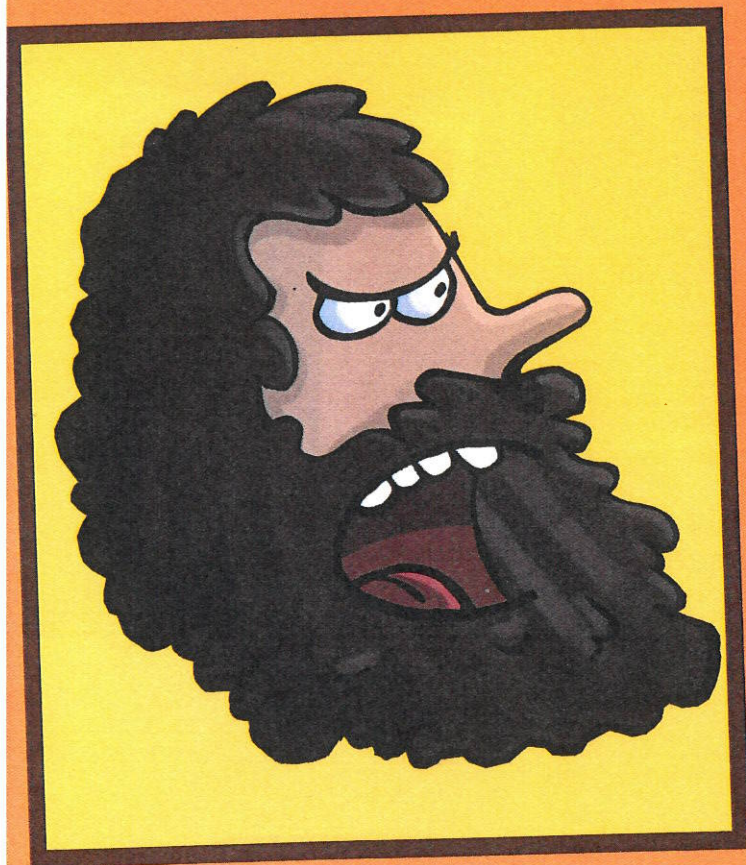

Because he could not see, Saul's men led him by the hand into Damascus. He wasn't mean or bad any more.

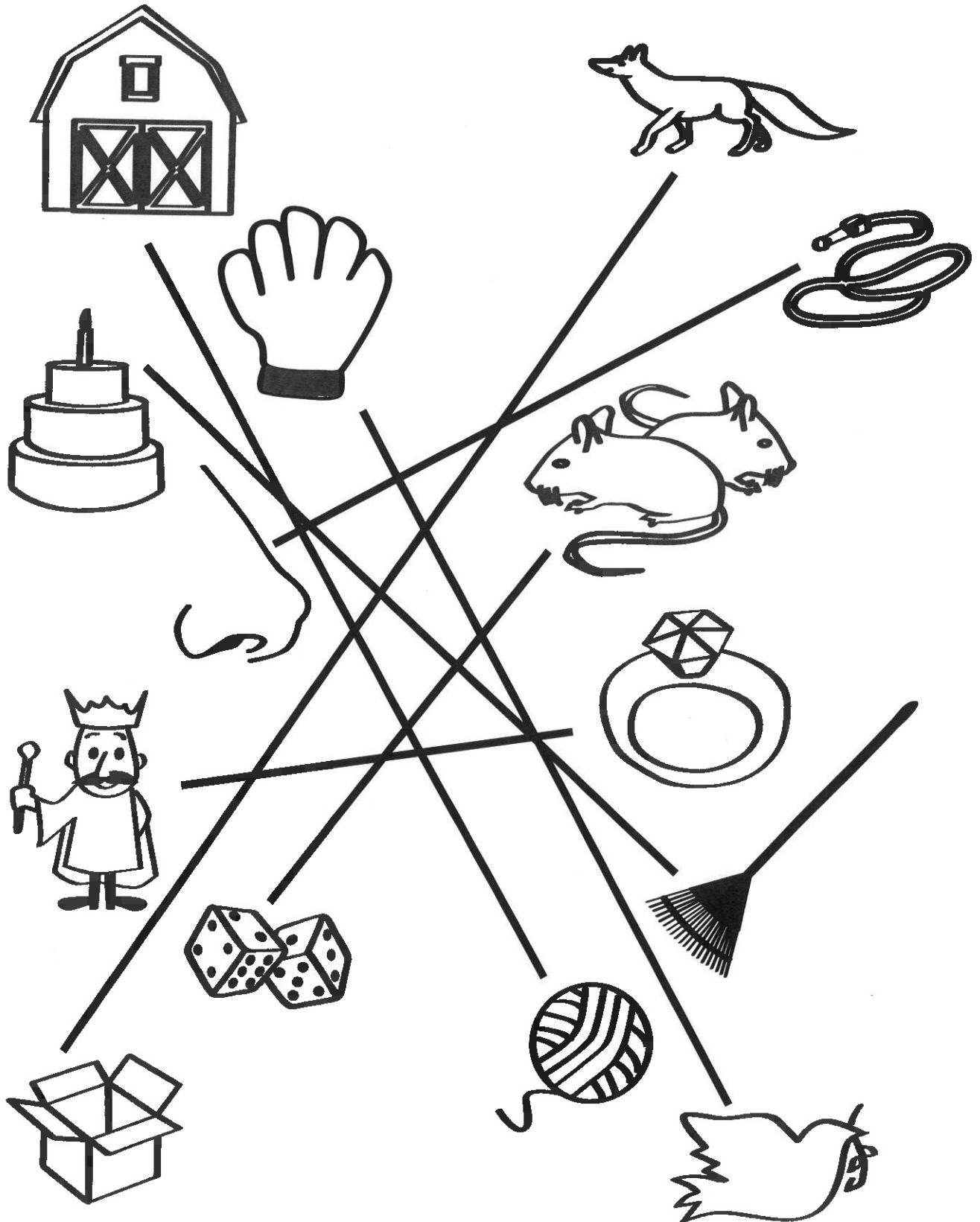

## Rounding the Bases

As she rounded first base, the ball was still in the air. Sally ran faster, thinking triple. Rounding second, she saw the left fielder misplay the ball. At the last second, Sally zigged and fell into a perfect slide. Her body just missed the catcher's leg. Her left arm trailed behind, and her fingertips just touched the edge of home plate. The catcher's glove arrived at the same time, knocking Sally's hand off the bag.

The crowd stood stunned, waiting for the umpire's call.

## Fun Facts

It would have taken about a week to **walk** from Jerusalem to Damascus.

**Damascus** is one of the oldest continuously-lived-in cities in the world.

**Ananias** is believed to be one of Jesus' 70 disciples from Luke 10.

The city of **Tarsus** is located in present-day Turkey.

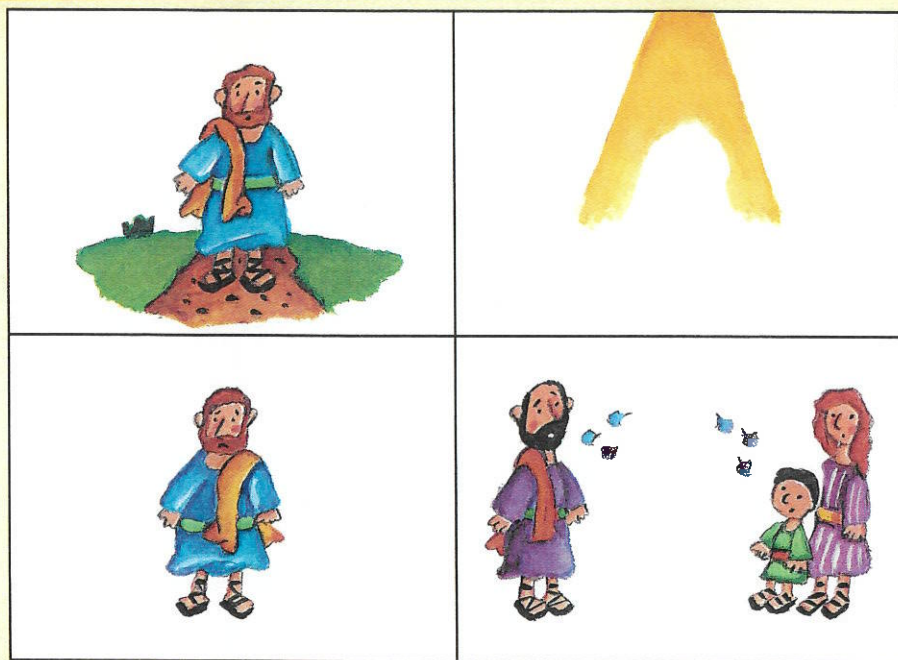
The city of **Tarsus** was an important learning center at the time of Paul.

A **growing number** of Christians were meeting in Damascus's synagogues during Paul's time.

## Wonder Turner

A thaumatrope is an optical illusion. *Thaumatrope* means "wonder turner" in Greek. Two images are shown quickly so that our eyes see them as one picture.

Saul was an enemy of the early Christians who turned into one of Christianity's strongest voices! That's a pretty wonderful turn of events! Make a thaumatrope of Paul. You have two scenes—Saul on the road to Damascus or Saul in a house regaining his sight. Cut out the two panels for the scene, tape a pencil to the back of one of the scenes, and then tape the scenes together. Hold the pencil between your palms and rub together quickly. What do you see?

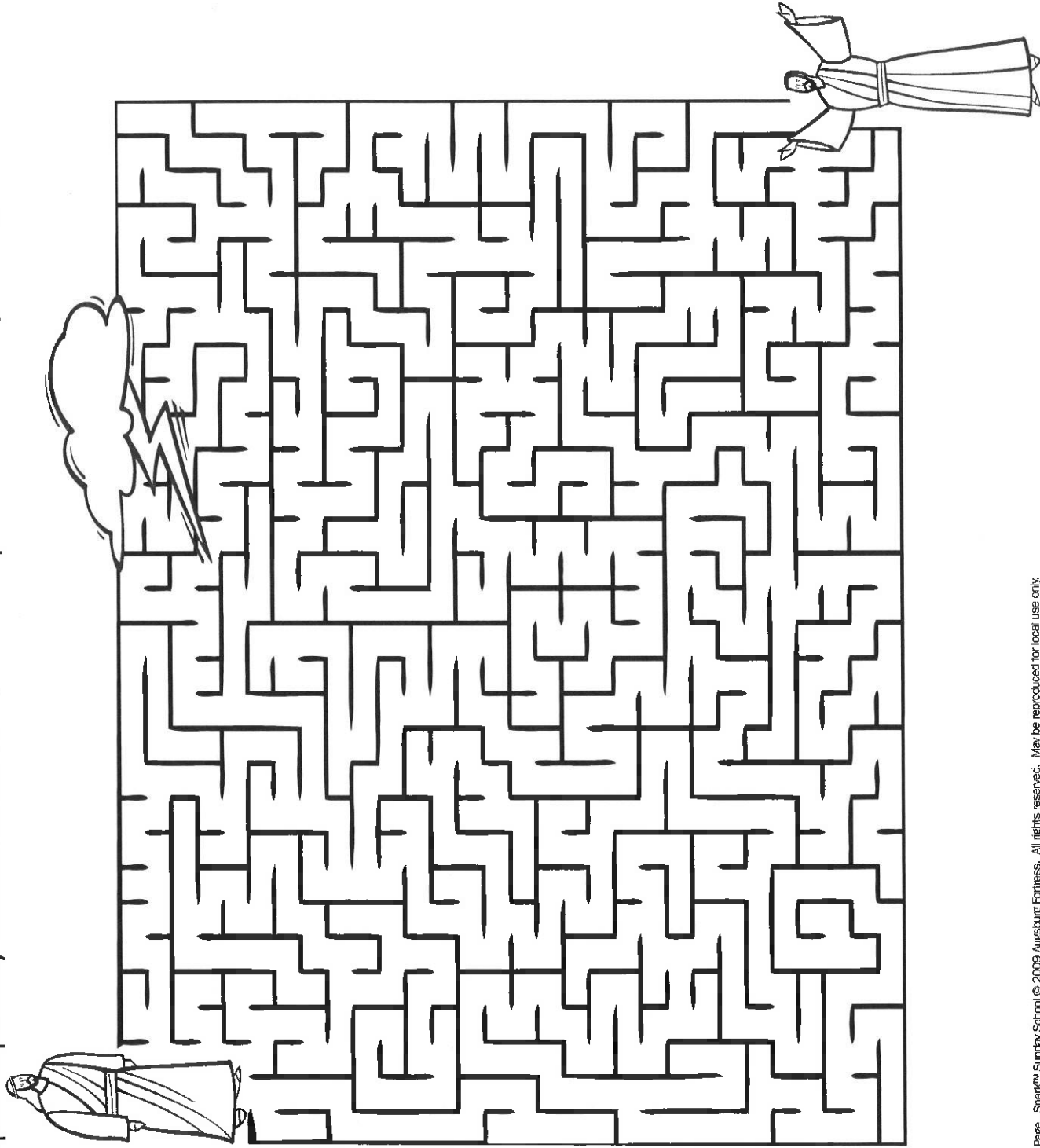
**Use** parts of Psalm 30 to create a song of thanks for God's help and protection.

**Pray** by changing body positions as you ask Jesus to change you so you can be more like him.

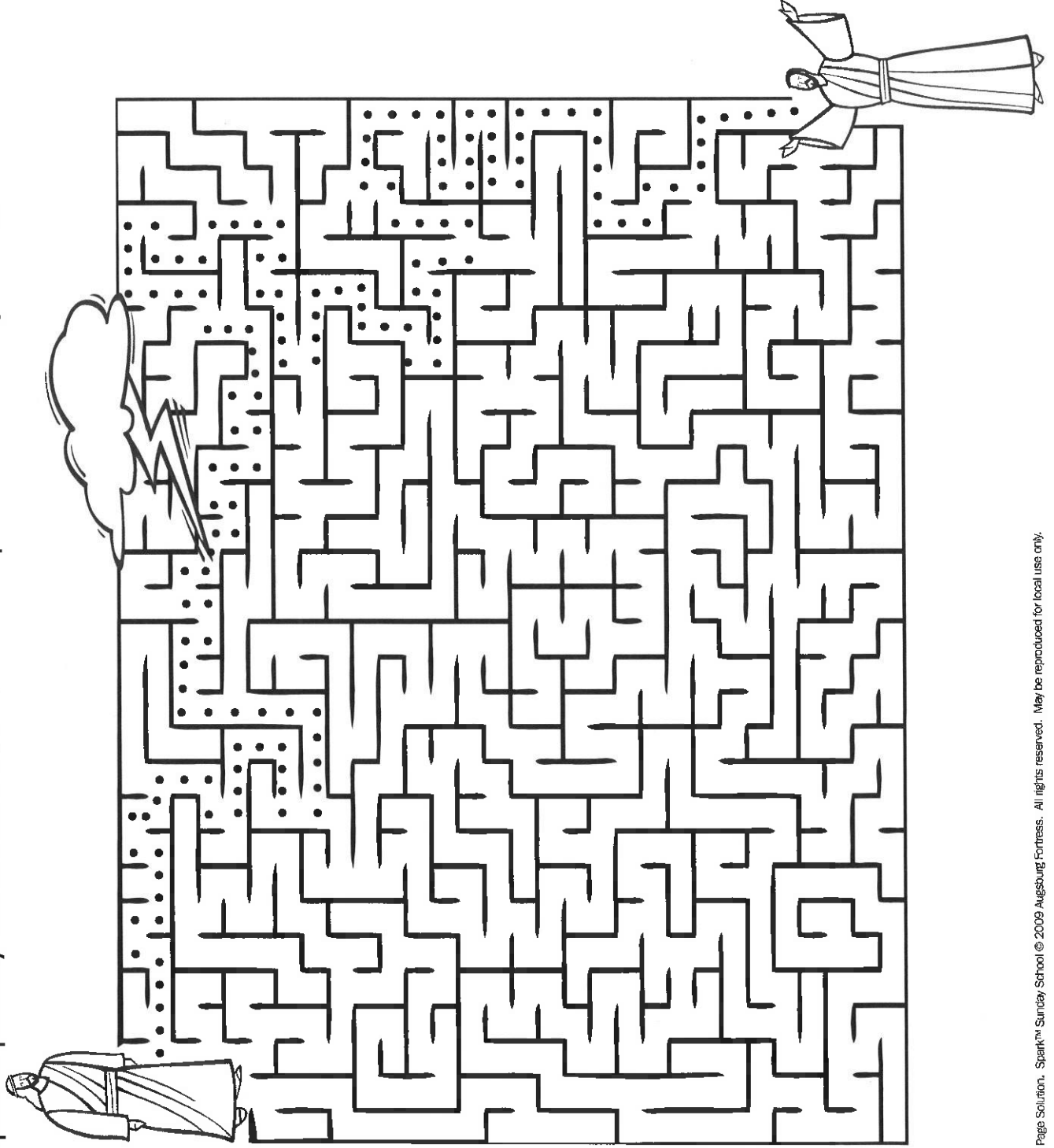

## Did You Know?

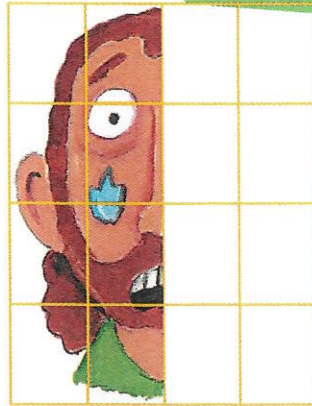
