Here Is the Synagogue

Jesus went to synagogues all over, including Nazareth. He wanted to teach people about God in these holy places where people worshiped. Use your fingers and hands to help tell this Bible story about Jesus:

Today's Bible story, Jesus Goes to Nazareth, is from the Gospel of Luke.


The word gospel means "good news." God sent Jesus to share




Jesus went to the synagogue in Nazareth. Synagogues are holy places where Jewish people worship God. Inside a synagogue, you can see these things:

A **Rabbi** is a Jewish leader who teaches and preaches. **Yarmulkes**, or "skull caps," are small hats worn by Jewish men to remind them of God.



A **menorah** is a "candelabra," a candle holder with branches to hold many candles.




The **Torah** scrolls include the words from the five holy books: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy.







I waited till Marcus let his hand drop, and then I


turned. Sure enough, The Giant was sitting in the back pew, chewing sunflower seeds and spitting the shells into a pop can.


"It's a good thing we start with this," he said, pointing to the page. "Randy's in the right place. And if you two pay attention, you'll see that you need to be here too."

The phrase "hometown prophet" is used when someone isn't listened to or respected in the place where they're from.





Did You Know?

During Jesus' time, Jewish kids began going to school at the age of 4 or 5. By the time kids were 10, they had memorized long portions of the Torah, the first 5 books of the Bible. The best students continued to attend school. Some of them became teachers, or rabbis, themselves. In Bible time, being a teacher was one of the best and most respected jobs a person could have.




