





### On the Road to Jericho

The man who got hurt was traveling from the town of Jerusalem to the town of Jericho. Both Jerusalem and Jericho are cities in Israel today. Jerusalem is in the mountains and Jericho is in a deep valley.

Jericho and Jerusalem are 17 miles (27.2 km apart).





Jericho

This is how long the journey could take:

Walking: 4-6 hours

Riding a bike: 1-2 hours

Riding a horse: 30 – 60 minutes

**Driving at highway speeds:** less than 20 minutes

Flying in a helicopter: less than 10 minutes





Two denarii was enough to pay for a two months stay at the inn.


**The lawyer** in this story was a scribe, an interpreter of God's law.



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
#### Neighbor Maze




