Gracious God, we thank you for sending down the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost. Give us hearts to feel the Holy Spirit's presence every day. Amen.

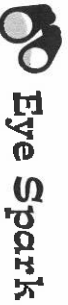
TALK ABOUT IT



Family Conversations

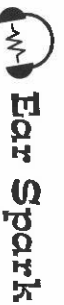
- 1 What did the Holy Spirit look like? (fire) Feel like? (wind) Sound like? (voices of the people)

LIVE IT

For families to do together

Pentecost marks the birthday of the Christian church when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples. Birthdays aren't complete without birthday cake! Make or buy cupcakes and place "trick" candles on each one. Sing "Happy Birthday" to the church. When you try to blow out the candles, explain that the candles are like the Holy Spirit. The flames of the candles will not go out, just like the Holy Spirit will never leave us!

For younger kids

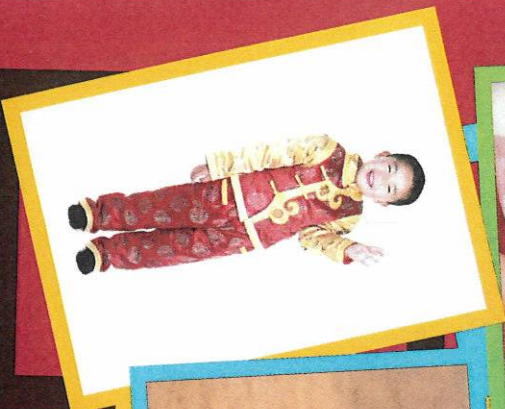
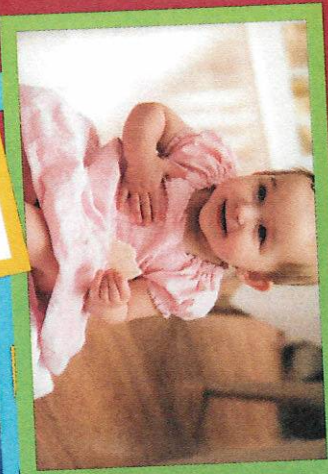
Create reminders of the Holy Spirit's presence in your home by making luminaries for outside your doorway. You will need a brown paper lunch bag, sand, a votive candle, scissors and masking tape. Create a few cross shapes from the masking tape and stick them to the inside of the paper bag. Fill the bag with 3 inches of sand and secure a candle in the center of the bag. Parents should light the luminaries with a stick of spaghetti or long match. (If you can't light flames, use battery-powered candles instead.)

For older kids

Use your computer to go to biblegateway.com. Do a "quick search" of Acts 2:4 in English and read it aloud. Now change the version of the passage to one in a different language and attempt to read it aloud. Figure out which word means "spirit" in the new language.

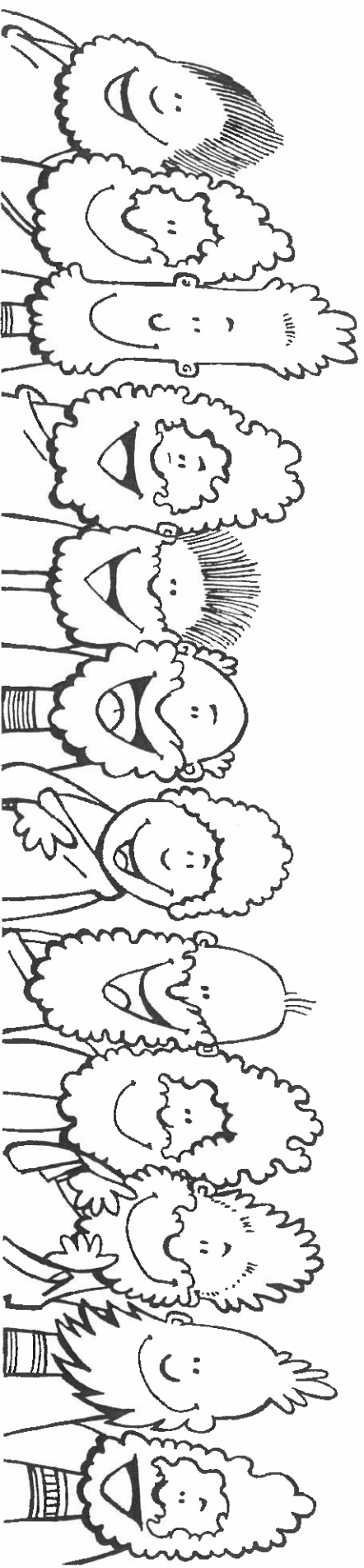
Talking and Talking...

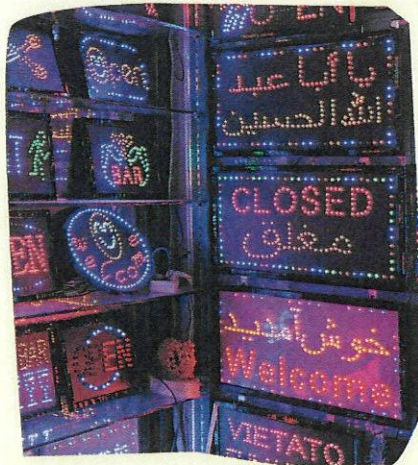

Take Your Daughter to Work Day. It's the first year Mariah gets to go to this. She's isn't quite sure about all the specifics of what her dad does, but he often comes home with powdered sugar on his tie, so she knows there are donuts involved. Even if shadowing him gets boring, she gets to skip school for an entire day with no homework.

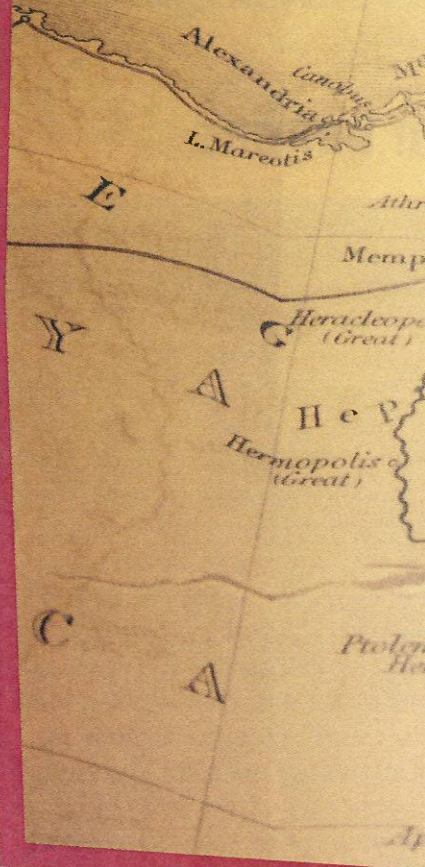
After a meeting at his office (where she immediately spied the powdered donuts), Mariah, her dad, and one of his coworkers Alejandra drove to a part of the city Mariah had never seen. It was like being in a foreign country: store signs were in different languages and the scents blowing out of restaurants didn't smell like the fast-food chains where she lived. On the crowded sidewalks, it was confusing to hear so many voices speaking words she didn't recognize.

Over the next few hours, they went to several homes and met many nice people. Mariah was surprised at how comfortable her dad seemed, greeting people in phrases she didn't understand. Her dad could speak other languages? She didn't know this! The woman with them was translating longer conversations. Her dad wrote things down on official-looking files. She guessed it was important for people to hear things in their own language, whatever her dad was saying.

The language you learn as a child is called your **mother tongue**.

More than **6,909 languages** are spoken in the world today.

Around **533 languages** are spoken in North America, but some only by a handful of people.

The **top five languages** of the world are Chinese, Spanish, English, Arabic, and Hindi.

At 1.2 billion, **Chinese** users total more than the next top four language speakers combined.

Every year, there are **fewer living languages**—those still in use.

- 1) **Parthians:** Parthia was a region of present-day northeastern Iran. Among their accomplishments, the Parthians invented a primitive battery.
- 2) **Medes:** These people lived in lived northwestern portions of present-day Iran. It's possible they named themselves for Medea, from Greek mythology.
- 3) **Elamites:** Their civilization sprang up east of the Tigris and Euphrates rivers. Their language, Elamite, was the official tongue of the Persian Empire between the 6th and 4th centuries B.C.E.
- 4) **Mesopotamia:** Also known as the "Fertile Crescent," formed by the Tigris and Euphrates and former home of the Babylonian Empire.
- 5) **Judea:** The mountainous southern part of ancient Israel.
- 6) **Cappadocia:** Now part of central Turkey and once part of the Persian Empire. The Cappadocians of Jesus' time probably followed Judaism.
- 7) **Pontus:** Located in modern-day northeastern Turkey on the southeastern coast of the Black Sea. Known for its mountainous terrain.
- 8) **Phrygia:** Part of an old empire that occupied much what is of modern-day Turkey; known for the city Galatia, from where the Bible book Galatians gets its name.
- 9) **Pamphylia:** Located in the south of Turkey near the northeastern Mediterranean coast. The name translates to "all tribes of Dorians," indicating its Greek heritage.
- 10) **Cyrene:** An ancient Greek colony in northern Libya on the southern Mediterranean coast, southwest of Crete.
- 11) **Cretans:** Inhabitants of the island of Crete, south of Greece in the Mediterranean Sea.

Did You Know?

According to the Linguistic Society of America, the Bible had been translated as of 1997 into 2,197 languages. But many, many more languages exist in the world. How many? At least 6,809, according to figures the LSA cites from the non-profit organization Ethnologue.

Disciple Talk

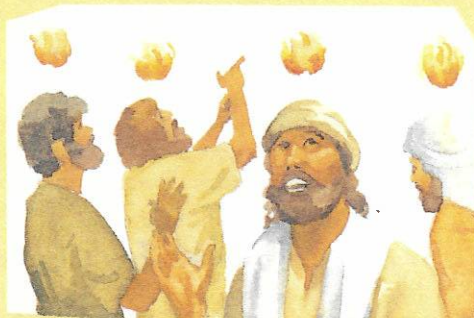
What languages did the disciples probably speak, or at least have familiarity with? Here's a quick look at the candidates:

Aramaic: This is the language Jesus spoke as his native tongue.

Hebrew: Spoken by upper-class Jews as a literary and scriptural language, Jesus may have used this in debates with the Pharisees.

Latin: The official language of the Roman Empire, which ruled over the Holy Land at the time Jesus and his disciples lived.

Greek: Many scholars and intellectuals spoke this language, as did Gentiles living around Nazareth.

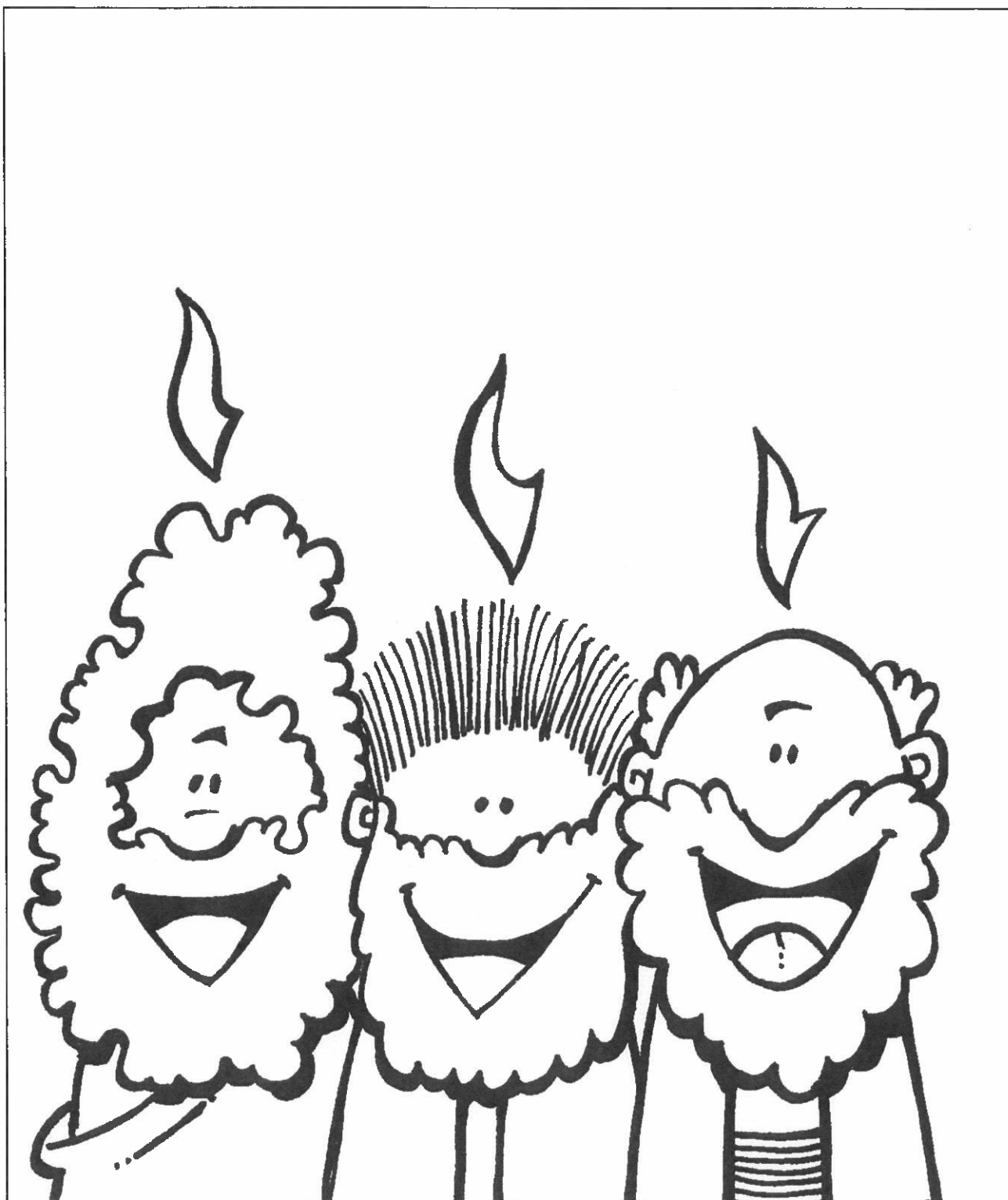

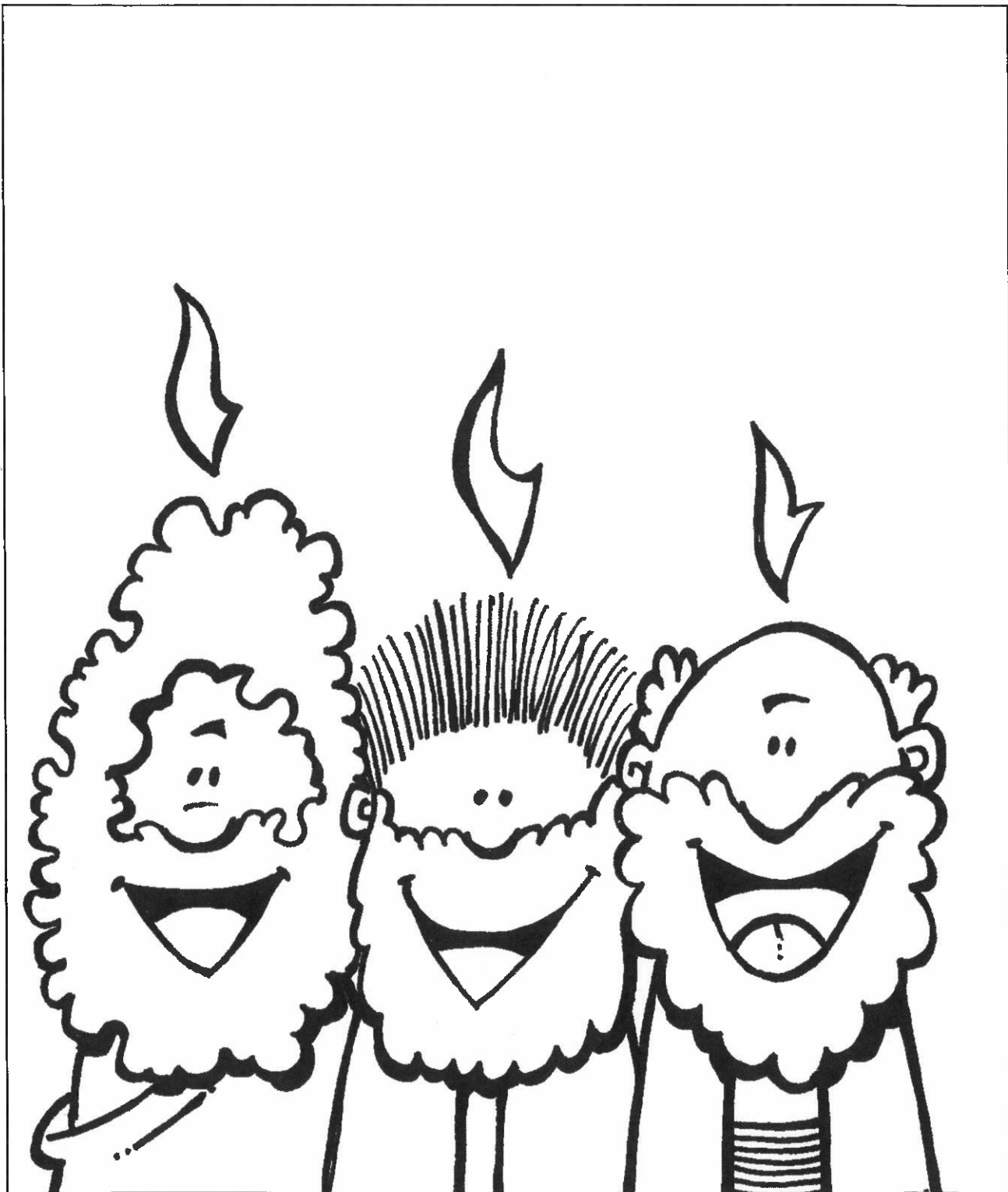
