

The third day: Those 4 people each





"We'll have to skateboard when he's not home," Caleb said.



The Nile River in Egypt is 4,184 miles (6,733 km) long.

Egyptian leaders were called "king" by the people. Greeks and Hebrews called them pharaohs.

Both men and women rulers were called "king."


The Nile River overflows its banks every spring and leaves behind rich soil.

The Egyptians had many gods. Some gods looked like a falcon, cobra, dog, or cat.

Bitumen and pitch would be called asphalt and far today.

Journal your thoughts about the ways that God has protected you.


Create a lullaby and sing it for a baby you know.






